- 1) Do you have or would you install a written policy in your office regarding sexual orientation and gender identity discrimination? Yes, all workplaces should be open and affirming with written policies in place to protect their guests and employees.
- 2) Have you started or would you start sensitivity training for your staff members regarding LGBT-related issues? **Yes.**
- 3) Have you taken or would you take any steps to further HIV/AIDS treatment and education programs? If so, what are those measures? My partner is a PrEP coordinator with Howard Brown Health Center. I would like to see the City of Chicago expand access to PrEP and build upon existing HIV/AID education programs.
- 4) What is your position on abortion as it pertains to the law? I am in full support of a woman's right to make her own decisions in regards to her own body.
- 5) What is your position regarding funding for HIV/AIDS treatment and education? I support funding for HIV/AIDS treatment and education and would work to find sites in my ward to hold such programs.
- 6) Do you favor marriage equality (marriage between two people of the same gender)? I wholeheartedly support marriage equality and its expansion to every state in our union.
- 7) Do you favor hate-crimes legislation that increases penalties for crimes committed based on the sexual orientation or gender identity of the person attacked? **Yes.**

 As an openly gay leader at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, I sponsored and successfully led a coalition to get \$50,000 a year in funding for LGBT programs.

Of the homeless youth in our country today 40% of them identify themselves as LGBTQ; either being kicked out by their families or forced out due to verbal and/or physical abuse. Our LGBT community must ensure that we are providing these youth with resources and support they need. I will work to ensure that Chicago's LGBT community and City Hall is supporting all members of our LGBT family.
