## Mainstream Media Improves



A Time, Sept. 8, 1975.
In the post-Stonewall era, the mainstream media began to improve in coverage of the LGBT community, but in fits and starts. The AIDS crisis forced changes inside and outside of mainstream media, as many journalists were impacted by AIDS both personally and professionally. The founding of NLGJA also had an immeasurable impact on the shift in LGBT coverage.

The earliest known homosexualfocused publication in the U.S. was Friendship and Freedom, produced by the short-lived, Chicago-based Society for Human Rights, founded by gay postal worker Henry Gerber (who was inspired by homosexual media he saw in Germany during World War I). There were also progressive and arts-oriented publications that were inclusive of diverse sexual and gender identities.


Lisa Ben's 1940 s lesbian newsletter Vice Versa was followed by ONE, Mattachine Review, The Ladder and other short- and longerterm media for general and special interests in the community.



## Post-Stonewall L.GBT Media

There were dozens of pre-Stonewall U.S. LGBT publications, but in 1969, there was a huge increase in media outlets, some that lasted just a few issues, some that are still publishing today. On this page are a few of the Chicago LGBT publications from the 1970s.
