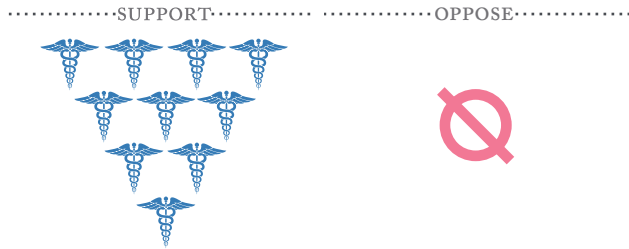


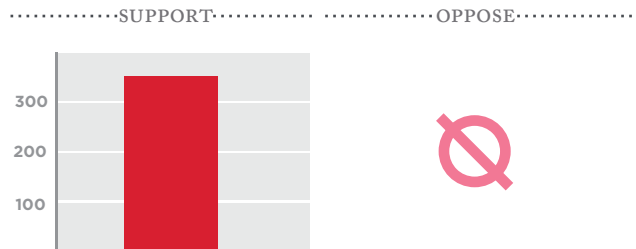

PRESTIGIOUS MEDICAL ORGANIZATIONS



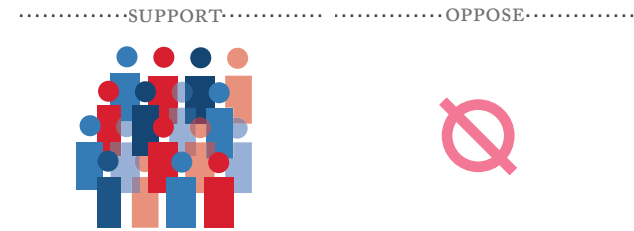
10 MEDICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH ORGANIZATIONS support of the freedom to marry, including the AMA and the American Academy of Pediatrics. *Not one medical organization filed in support of DOMA or Prop. 8.*

BUSINESS & EMPLOYERS



Taken together, **OVER 300 LEADING BUSINESSES** signed onto *Perry* and *Windsor*, urging the Court to strike down DOMA and Prop 8. *Not a single employer, large or small, filed in opposition.*

LABOR



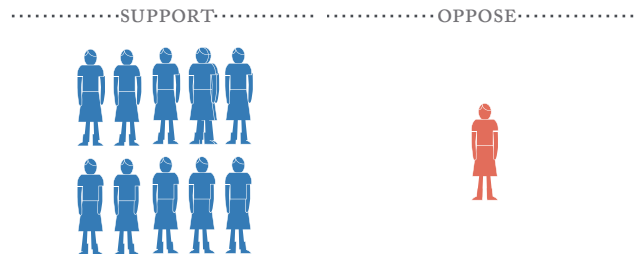
The AFL-CIO, SEIU, Change to Win and National Education Association, representing **OVER 20-MILLION WORKING AMERICANS**, filed briefs in support. *Not a single labor group signed onto the opposition.*

MILITARY



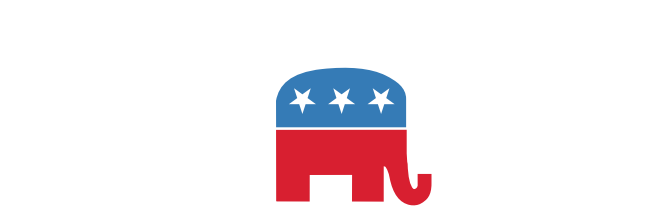
30 FORMER MILITARY AND NATIONAL DEFENSE OFFICIALS joined amici supporting marriage equality. *No military personnel filed in support of the opponents.*

WOMEN'S ORGANIZATIONS



10 WELL RESPECTED WOMEN'S ORGANIZATIONS, including the National Partnership for Women and Families filed support for marriage equality. *Only one—the Concerned Women for America—filed for opponents.*

REPUBLICANS



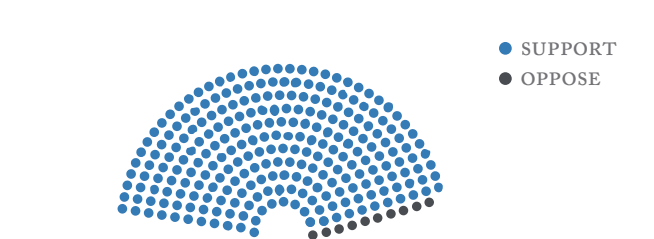
131 PROMINENT REPUBLICANS signed a brief supporting the freedom to marry, including four former governors and Party leaders and two current members of Congress.

CIVIL RIGHTS ORGANIZATIONS



SEVERAL CIVIL RIGHTS ORGANIZATIONS including the NAACP and the Anti-Defamation League filed in support of the freedom to marry. *Not one filed in opposition.*

CONGRESS



212 MEMBERS OF CONGRESS signed briefs urging the Court to strike down DOMA. *Only 10 Senators filed a brief in opposition.*
